The American Jewish World published its first issue July 30, 1915. A publisher's note explained that the periodical — billed as “A Weekly Journal of Modern Jewish Life and Labors” — was a continuation of The Jewish Weekly, which appeared in 1912 and folded after six months.

After 110 years of continuous publication — the longest-running community newspaper in Minnesota — the Jewish World will celebrate its longevity with a special commemorative edition in July.
